Message from the Executive Director

"And once the storm is over, you won't remember how you made it through, how you managed to survive. You won't even be sure whether the storm is really over. But one thing is certain. When you come out of the storm, you won't be the same person who walked in. That's what this storm's all about." —Haruki Murakami

2020 will be forever imbedded in our memories as the year that we all walked through a storm. A storm that not only changed the world, it changed each and every one of us. Some will look back with anger; some will look back with sadness; some will look back in awe; and some will look back with pride. We have all walked through this storm and although it is the same storm, it is very different for each person.

This storm has impacted Mountain Rose Center services because as an 'essential service' every program has remained open. We worked closely with public health officials and the Government of Alberta to ensure our services followed the protocols as set out for the pandemic. This means that we needed to limit capacity from 21 beds to 15 beds in the Emergency Shelter, implemented mask mandates, physical distancing and changed our processes to ensure safety protocols are in place. Even with these limitations, from April 1 to September 30, the Mountain Rose Center continued to provide services.

- 124 women and 37 children were kept safe in the Emergency Shelter.
- 6 families with 14 children accessed the Second Stage Transitional Program,
- 160 people utilized the Community Services Programs,
- And the Crisis Line received 351 crisis calls.

This storm is not over yet. Statistics show that shelters are the safest place for women and children experiencing violence even during this pandemic. Therefore, the Mountain Rose Center will remain open to serve our community and families impacted by violence. If you are experiencing violence or know someone who is in danger, please call the Crisis Line at 1-877-845-4141 to speak to a Crisis Worker at any time.

As Haruki Murakami wrote, "When you come out of the storm, you won't be the same person who walked in. That's what this storm's all about".

Stay safe everyone and we will see you on the other side of this storm.



Effects of domestic violence on children: Many children exposed to violence in the home are also victims of physical abuse. Children who witness domestic violence or are victims of abuse themselves are at serious risk for long-term physical and mental health problems. Children who witness violence between parents may also be at greater risk of being violent in their future relationships. If you are a parent who is experiencing abuse, it can be difficult to know how to protect your child.

For many, spending quality time with family and friends is a key part of the Christmas season.

But for some this is not something to look forward to as it means spending more time with those who make their lives miserable.

Domestic abuse can be experienced by anyone. It can occur between family members or those who have been intimate partners. It can happen to any generation and between generations, and can take many forms. In December, incidents of domestic abuse increase, though victims often wait until after the holidays to seek help.

Over Christmas, the consumption of alcohol can increase the severity and frequency of instances of domestic abuse. It is not the cause of domestic abuse, but can exacerbate the likelihood of a perpetrator committing an offence, as they may become more aggressive or violent.
