

A Message from our Executive Director by CINDY EASTON

Ms. King's words echoed in my mind as I heard about a group of our community members that worked diligently to find a safe, warm place for those that were unhoused in our community during the -40C weather last month. This group of volunteers drove around town picking up people, taking hot food to those that chose not to access the 'Shelter', and made those that did access the shelter feel welcome and safe. This group of

individuals impacted the lives of 15 people who were struggling during this cold snap. In truth, this group of people most likely saved lives by taking action.

Many non-profit organizations in our community could not complete their missions if not for those that step up to act. I see this at the Mountain Rose Centre with our team of volunteers: those that help in the kitchen preparing food for the women and children in shelter; those that work on our special event fundraisers; those that volunteer to lead our organization as Board members; the community church that completes the annual food drive for MRC; the team of volunteers that work at our Dovercourt Bingo in September annually; those that work the Safe Ride Events on weekends almost year round; and those that help at the third party events like the Evergreen Coop BBQ.

The Rocky Dodge Show n' Shine, and the Shoppers Drug Mart Women's Health™ Giving Shelter fundraising campaign (to name

a few). All of this is due to the 'compassionate action' of community members, and this does highlight the greatness of our community.

HOW COMMUNITIES PERSEVERE IN TIMES OF ADVERSITY

Homelessness is a complex issue that requires a collective effort from the community to find effective solutions. Addressing this problem necessitates collaboration between various participants, including the government, local organizations, and individuals. While the government is doing its best to resolve the issues of homelessness, the community is also doing such a remarkable effort to contribute and support those people experiencing homelessness in town by means of donating essential needs and volunteering.

In January 2024, when the temperature dropped to a bone-chilling -40 degrees, Tamarack Hotel graciously opened its doors to welcome homeless individuals, offering them temporary relief from the freezing streets. With the support of kind-hearted volunteers from the community, who selflessly served food and provided blankets and other necessities, these individuals found solace and comfort even just for a few nights. Meanwhile, the Mountain Rose Women's Shelter continued its noble mission of providing a safe haven for displaced and homeless women offering these women not only shelter but also essential needs, ensuring they were cared for during these challenging times. Additionally, MRWSA thru the help of various community partners is organizing a one-day event called "Stone Soup for Housing" to be held on March 21, 2024, with the aim to discuss and understand the barriers that encompass homelessness and the various solutions available. 

Community Engagement



Outreach Programs

When we come across another person on our path, we never know how far they are on their journey. Some may be farther along their path, while others may have just begun forging a new path.

Our Outreach team meets clients where they are at and have a chance to walk with them a short while on their path. You never know when you can be that one person who can spark up a meaningful conversation—or have the right words at the right moment.

We continue to meet one on one with clients staying in shelter, as well as a variety of community clients (we support clients of all ages and genders) in accessing services in and around the community. This can range from obtaining identification, referrals to medical, and Mental Health & Addictions. We can also assist with court support, and other needs specific to each client.

We offer a Women's Support Group every other Thursday from 2:00-3:30 pm March 7 & 21/2024, then every other Thursday continuing from there on. Support group offers a safe, non-judgmental space where everyone is welcome, and have their voice heard. We learn about healthy relationships, boundaries, stress, self-care and many more topics.

We hope this new season will bring some hope and kindness to you.

Community Outreach

Community Outreach Services focuses on making available the supports and services offered through Mountain Rose Centre to communities surrounding Rocky Mountain House to reduce access and transportation barriers to individuals seeking support for family violence and abuse.

Recently I had the pleasure of setting up an information table at the Beat the Blues Winter Wellness Festival that took place at the Asokewin Friendship Centre in Rocky Mountain House. It was a fun day of sharing information and connecting with both community members and other agencies and organizations providing services for personal, family, and community



wellness.

A similar community wellness event is coming up on March 23, 2024, form 1pm-4pm, in Caroline. The Caroline Community Wellness Tailgate Party will take place at the Caroline Community Hub and will include tables providing information on encouraging mental, emotional, physical, and spiritual wellness, and offering the community information on activities and resources to combat the 'Winter Blues'. The afternoon will include a free BBQ lunch, outdoor and indoor activities, door prizes, wellness tips, and information on local services and supports. In the past few month Community Outreach has focused on establishing partnerships in communities surrounding Rocky Mountain House to establish peer support Women's Wellness groups, with the focus on engaging women in a safe and supported space to speak of and share conversation and grow in knowledge on building healthy relationships, recognizing signs of unhealthy relationships and abuse, building healthy boundaries, and empowering each other to live a life free from violence and abuse.



Volunteers Needed

SAFE RIDE/ BARTENDING PROGRAM

This program provides services to community events such as weddings and company parties (Christmas, Staff Appreciation, etc.) for a fee.

This may be for one service or both. This program raises up to \$10,000 annually to assist the Mountain Rose Centre in providing a variety of services.

MRWSA has special insurance to provide coverage for any volunteer involved in these volunteer opportunities.

Safe Ride - volunteers use their own vehicle to provide safe transport from the event to where guest(s) are staying within 15km of RMH. The time commitment is usually 3 hours from 10 PM to 1 AM but this may fluctuate. Mileage can be reimbursed to the driver. Any cash tips received from guests are to be considered donations to MRWSA.

Bartending - volunteers support events by completing bar service to patrons. One volunteer per event must have ProServe. The time commitment is 6-8 hours usually from 6PM to 1 AM, however, this may fluctuate. Any cash tips received from guests are to be considered donations to MRWSA.
