Outreach provides support to individuals, who have experienced abuse, violence or control in their relationships. We offer support, information, & education to anyone (women, men & children) who seek to live a life free of violence for themselves & their families.

Outreach provides the following support:

- Information/education on the dynamics of family violence & abuse
 (i.e. cycle of violence, power & control, effects of abuse, etc.)
- Crisis intervention & support
- ❖ Safety assessment & planning
- * Support in identifying individual needs and concerns
- Provide information on protection orders & custody issues
- Information & referrals to community supports based on individual needs
 (i.e. legal, financial, social services, counselling, etc.)
- ❖ Follow-up support for women who are in the process of leaving the shelter
- Assistance with basic provisions, including donated household items & goods
- * Support & promote an individual's ability to make their own choices.
- Community support & education

Our weekly open drop-in groups provide women in our community a confidential, non-judgemental space that gives them the opportunity to share their stories, build a community of support and gain *education, awareness, insight, healing and growth* on a variety of topics.

Path's of Change: Phase 1 & 2 ~ closed program offered throughout the year

Path's of Change is a unique 2 phase program that offers the participants an opportunity to share, discover and create a process where they can start on the journey of healing, creating paths of self-discovery, awareness, resiliency, resourcefulness and wholeness. We will be looking at topics such as: What is abuse, roots of abuse/family patterns, the effects of abuse (on self & children), emotional health, understanding trauma, moving beyond shame, anger, grief & loss, exploring triggers/vulnerabilities & defense mechanisms, building a practice of resiliency, self-compassion, healthy boundaries, and effective communication.
